## **Create a secondary account and desactive root account**

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Just create a secondary account:

```
adduser support-ip-of-your-server  
passwd support-ip-of-your-server
```

(introduce 2 times the new passwd for support-ip-of-your-server)

Edit the file **/etc/ssh/sshd\_config**

Replace

```
PermitRootLogin=yes
```

by

```
PermitRootLogin=no
```

Save your file and restart ssh with **/etc/init.d/ssh restart**

Advice: Do not close your ssh connection, try first on another computer if you can access with the secondary account.

When done, type **su -**

Then introduce the root pswd.

If this succeed, it means it will be needed now to use this procedure to enter in your server, and voip hacker will be desappointed, because direct access to the root account is forbidden, and how to guess the login and password of the secondary account ???
